Canadian Newstand Database: For newspaper and magazine articles.

1. Start at **saskatoonlibrary.ca**
2. Click "**Services**". Click on "**Research**".
3. Click **SUBJECT**. Scroll down and on the Left side click on "**Newspapers & Journals**".
4. Click "**Canadian Newstand.**" If you aren't at the library, type in your Library card number. Type in the last 4 digits of your phone number.
5. At the top of the page click on "**Change Databases**". You can add more databases. Add **CBCA** (Canadian Business & Current Affairs) **Reference & Current Events**. Click "**Use selected databases.**"
6. Type "**carbon tax**" in the Search box. Using quotations will improve your search results. Select "**Full text.**"
7. At "**Relevance**" (on the Left side) choose "**Most recent first**". Click **Sort**.
